Fall is our favorite time of year around here...and for good reason. With the stunning fall colors all around and a never-ending list of fall activities and attractions to keep you entertained, a fall trip to Brown County is a must. Here are some tips to maximize your fall getaway to Brown County!

Morning:

Early risers can get a heads start on enjoying the beautiful fall foliage on a brisk, morning hike through the State Park. See the leaves and check out local wildlife from the water on a Fall Colors Kayak Tour through areas of the Hoosier National Forest and along the backside of the State Park. For those more interested in a leisurely start to the day, the Village offers several tasty breakfast dining options. Enjoy your coffee on a late morning stroll through the streets of Nashville and take in the charming fall decorations on display.

Afternoon:

Spend the afternoon in the heart of downtown and admire unique, handmade art in the area's many shops. Sample some tasty treats along the way and savor some local flavor during lunch. Be sure to check out the remarkable leaf sculpture "Soaring" standing tall in front of the Visitors Center. Combine art and the outdoors on the Backroads of Brown County Studio Tours. See the fall colors and enjoy local artists at work in their homes as you drive along the back roads of the county. Wanting something more adventurous? Try zip lining, canoeing, or mountain biking. Hill Climb Buggy Tours are also an option for all the thrill-seekers out there. See the beautiful leaves from behind the wheel of a 75-Hp, four-wheel drive two seat buggy. The area also has several pumpkin patches, apple orchards, and corn mazes worth checking out. Getting into the fall spirit isn't hard to do in Brown County!

Evening/Night:

Admire the fall foliage on an evening stroll in the State Park and enjoy the sunset at one of the park's scenic overlooks. Head back to the Village for some scrumptious cuisine. From pizza to good ol' fashioned favorites, there's something for everyone. Stop by the Visitors Center to browse a book of menus and pick what's best for you! Shake down dinner on a walk through the streets of Nashville or slip into one of several restaurants and venues offering live music. Relax to the talent of local musicians all while enjoying beer, wine, and spirits created right here in Brown County. Up for some fall frights, check out one of the area's haunted attractions including Cedar Rock Haunted Trail—the longest in the Midwest, Brown County State Park Haunted Trail, and the Slightly Haunted Marionette Theatre.
